The **Objectives** of this session is to review recent and updated Operational Ration operating policies as follows:

- Humanitarian and Religious Meals
- TOTEM and MARC Meals
- Supplements-Enhancements

Humanitarian Meals

- HPM and HDR are not an operational rations.
- Menus are developed solely for and by authority of the **Defense Security Cooperation Agency** for special humanitarian activity.
- Army units should not order these without express guidance from the **Army G-4**.
- They are not nutritionally balanced for troop feeding but rather for **austere feeding conditions**.



Religious Meals



- **Army Regulation 600-20 (Chapter 5), titled *Accommodating religious dietary practices*.**
- **Dietary restrictions are normally prohibitions against specific foods more than requirements to eat only a few select foods.**
- **Meals-ready-to-eat (MRE) should accommodate most soldiers with religious dietary concerns and may be the only ration available.**



Religious Meals

- **Kosher Ration is 8970-01-E10-0001
Halal Ration is 8970-01-E10-0002.**
- **Used to feed those individuals who have religious diet requirements.**
- **Use of these meals should be restricted by the Food Advisor to meet the specific goal while avoiding the cost of general use.**
- **Unit Chaplains can assist command by certifying the personnel that require this benefit.**



TOTEM and MARC

- **TOTEM and MARC are not an operational rations.**
- **Menus are developed solely for special needs.**
- **Reserve Components – Tailored Operational Training Meals**
- **Enemy Prisoner of War – Meal Alternative, Regionally Configured**



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Supplements & Enhancements



Supplements



THIS MESSAGE IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

Supplements are mandatory food items that are required when providing group rations. The office of the surgeon general requires that only milk is added to the group ration serving to aid in proper nutrition.

Enhancements



Use of enhancements is a decision to be made by the local commander.

Use local prime vendor numbers when possible.

Consult veterinary personnel for issues regarding food safety and approved source of certain food products.

Local command decisions are limited to the listing of authorized enhancements.



Warming/Cooling



Use of warming/cooling enhancements is a decision to be made by the local commander using local prime vendor support when possible.

Consult veterinary personnel for issues regarding food safety and approved source of certain food products.

Warming/Cooling enhancements are funded by special installation allotments or unit funds. Local command decisions are limited to funding rules and constraints.





Assault Kitchen



Army Heat on the Move Field Feeding

Changes to the UGR-H&S to address its use are underway.





The AK consists of a HMMWV, HMT, and a heater tank with burner unit that is used to rethermalize tray packs (poly or metal) and #10 cans.

- **Will replace the Kitchen Company Level Field Feeding.**
- **Can prepare enough rations to feed 250 within 90 minutes.**
- **Total Heat & Serve ration modifications**
- **Natick is studying a decision to right-size the PolyTray count.**
- **Institutional Pouch development is on-going.**

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

