

US Army Quartermaster Center and School Established

1962



US Army Quartermaster School dedicated its new Headquarters Building, Mifflin Hall, on 19 May 1961. The following year the Office of The Quartermaster General in Washington DC was abolished and the QM School at Fort Lee was formally designated "*Home of the Quartermaster Corps.*"

1973



Supply and Service Proponency. TRADOC and US Army Logistics Center was created in July 1973, and the QMC&S became the Army's main focal point, or *proponent*, for Supply and Service training, doctrine and combat developments.

1990



Fort Lee Realignment. QMC&S relinquished command of Fort Lee Garrison to the Logistics Center, which was reorganized and redesignated US Army Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM).

1992



Consolidation of MOSs. The 92A Automated Logistical Specialist was created by consolidating four separate QM supply and service MOSs (76C, 76P, 76V and 76X).

2005




BRAC 2005 designated Fort Lee as Sustainment Center of Excellence (SCoE) with plans to consolidate QM, OD, TC training, doctrine, & combat developments.



Logistics Training Department



- Provide basic unit supply (92Y10) and automation supply (92A10) training to Advance Individual Training (AIT) QM enlisted Soldiers
- Provide Mobile Training Team (MTT) and resident training classes in support of our Operational Forces:
 - Unit Armorer Certification Course (MTT)
 - 2-week course
 - 12 classes per year starting FY10
 - Unit Level Logistics System-Aviation Enhanced (ULLS-A/E) Resident Course
 - 2-week course
 - 18 classes per year starting FY10
 - An Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) course . Graduates receive an ASI C7

- Serves as the Joint Training and Doctrine Integrating Center to:
 - Develop doctrine and conduct Joint Mortuary Affairs
- Provide assistance and interpretation of joint doctrine for implementation in Joint Theaters of Operation
- Serves as the Executive Agent for the Department of the Army G-4 on all mortuary affairs matters.
- Provide advice and assistance as needed during:
 - Contingency operations
 - Mass fatality events

Petroleum and Water Department




- Train members from all branches of the Armed Services, allied nations, and Department of Defense Civilians on petroleum and water logistics systems, equipment and doctrine
